

ORDINANCE NO. 01 - 61

AN ORDINANCE TO VACATE A PORTION OF A ROAD
WHOLLY WITHIN TOWAMENSING TOWNSHIP,
CARBON COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

WHEREAS, because the hereinafter described portion of road has become useless, inconvenient and burdensome, it is in the interest of the public to vacate, by ordinance, the portion of road herein described, now therefore:

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Supervisors of Towamensing Township, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by authority of the same:

Section 1. That the following described portion of road be and the same is hereby vacated:

ALL THAT CERTAIN strip or portion of Alton Road, T-547, being thirty-three and no hundredths (33.00) feet in width, leading from Church Drive, T-474, to Siegre Drive, T-427, in the Township of Towamensing, County of Carbon, and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, being more fully bounded and described, in accordance with a survey performed by Victor R. Geiger, P.L.S., as follows, to wit:

BEGINNING at a concrete monument being in the northerly line of property of Jerusalem United Church of Christ, in Deed Book Volume 896, Page 399; said monument being in the southerly right-of-way line of relocated Alton Road, T-547, property of the Township of Towamensing in Deed Book Volume 902, Page 148; thence extending along the property of the Township of Towamensing extending along a curve deflecting to left with a radius of three hundred and eleven hundredths (300.11) feet, passing through the centerline of Alton Road, T-547, being vacated, at a central angle of seven (07) degrees thirty-one (31) minutes five (05)

Section 2. That the Township Solicitor is authorized and directed to file a certified copy of this Ordinance in the Office of the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas together with a draft or survey of such portion of road showing the location and width thereof.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
