Tom Nanovic stated this is a conditional use hearing requested by PA state police and Tower Services Unlimited to seek conditional use and construct and operate a radiant use 705 (F5) Communication tower to include an 80ft tall tower with antennas and related equipment located at 9170 Interchange Rd in Towamensing Township. Property is currently owned by EII-WB&L LP where PA State Police barracks resides. The facility is zoned light commercial zoning district where the communication tower and equipment are permitted as conditional use Section 505F by the Towamensing Township zoning ordinance and zoning officer, Carl Faust's statement that this is a conditional use in this zoning. Hearing was advertised in Times News. Was also sent to property owners as listed on application. This hearing is for conditional use and is not a variance. Applicants need to meet conditions that are set forth in the ordinance section 505F5 and also general conditions in section 704. If they meet the conditions the board has to approve the application unless this particular tower would cause harm to the health and safety and welfare to the community. Vincent stated PA state police respectfully requesting an 80ft radio communication tower be approved for safety of our troopers. Currently the state is involved in a state wide radio deployment upgrade on the entire radio system. The tower is required as the statewide upgrade to be put up in every station to implement the new system. The upgrade enhances the coverage of communication for our troopers. Vincent then went through all ordinances per Guy Seifert's request. Carl Faust said he could address issues in the ordinances instead of doing all of them. There was a resident that had concerns so had to go through them all. Vincent then went through all ordinances

Resident asked if towers at fire company could be used. Answer was no they are cell phone towers.

Vincent went through #6 – Can not plant evergreens. Plan is to put up fence with slats in. #16 Setback from the building – the closer the tower to the building the better the reception. Would have to run longer wires that would interfere with reception.

Barry Hahn had question about property zoning residential or commercial. Guy said they had to get a conditional use to move in the building as a state police barracks to change to commercial.
